

INTERNATIONAL RELATIONS AND EUROPEAN POLITICS

The programme delivers a progressive curriculum focused on developing soft and practical skills as well as research methods in the study field. Special emphasis is placed on granting students key skills for high-quality expert analytical work in both practice and academia. The programme encourages focused specialization through in-depth knowledge in selected areas of expertise, while offering refresher courses for applicants who previously achieved a bachelor education in a related field.

Compulsory courses constitute less than half of the required credits. Specialization is encouraged by a broad selection of optional courses around the two main components of the programme – international relations or European studies.

Graduates find employment worldwide in a number of professional areas, including: public administration and diplomatic services, international organizations, in research and analytical institutes, or in journalism and business.

HOW TO APPLY

Applications are open twice per year: 1 January–30 April for fall semester and 1 August–15 November for spring semester enrolment. The application should include: CV, statement of purpose, proof of proficiency in English, Bachelor's degree certificate, and essay.
